4. First-Aid Measures

Description of first aid measures

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General advice:

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Ensure adequate ventilation. Clean preferably with a detergent; avoid the use of solvents. Collect waste in suitable containers, which can be labeled and sealed.

7. Handling and Storage

Precautions for safe handling

Do not return residues to the storage containers. Provide good ventilation of working area (local exhaust ventilation if necessary). Avoid inhalation of vapour and spray mist. The workplace should be equipped with an emergency shower and eye-rinsing facility. Avoid contact with the skin, eyes and clothing. Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs. Warn users about safety measures and precautions to prevent accidents.

Suitable materials for containers: High density polyethylene (HDPE), Low density polyethylene (LDPE), Polyethyleneterephthalate (PET), Polypropylene (PP), Carbon steel (Iron), tinned carbon steel (Tinplate)
